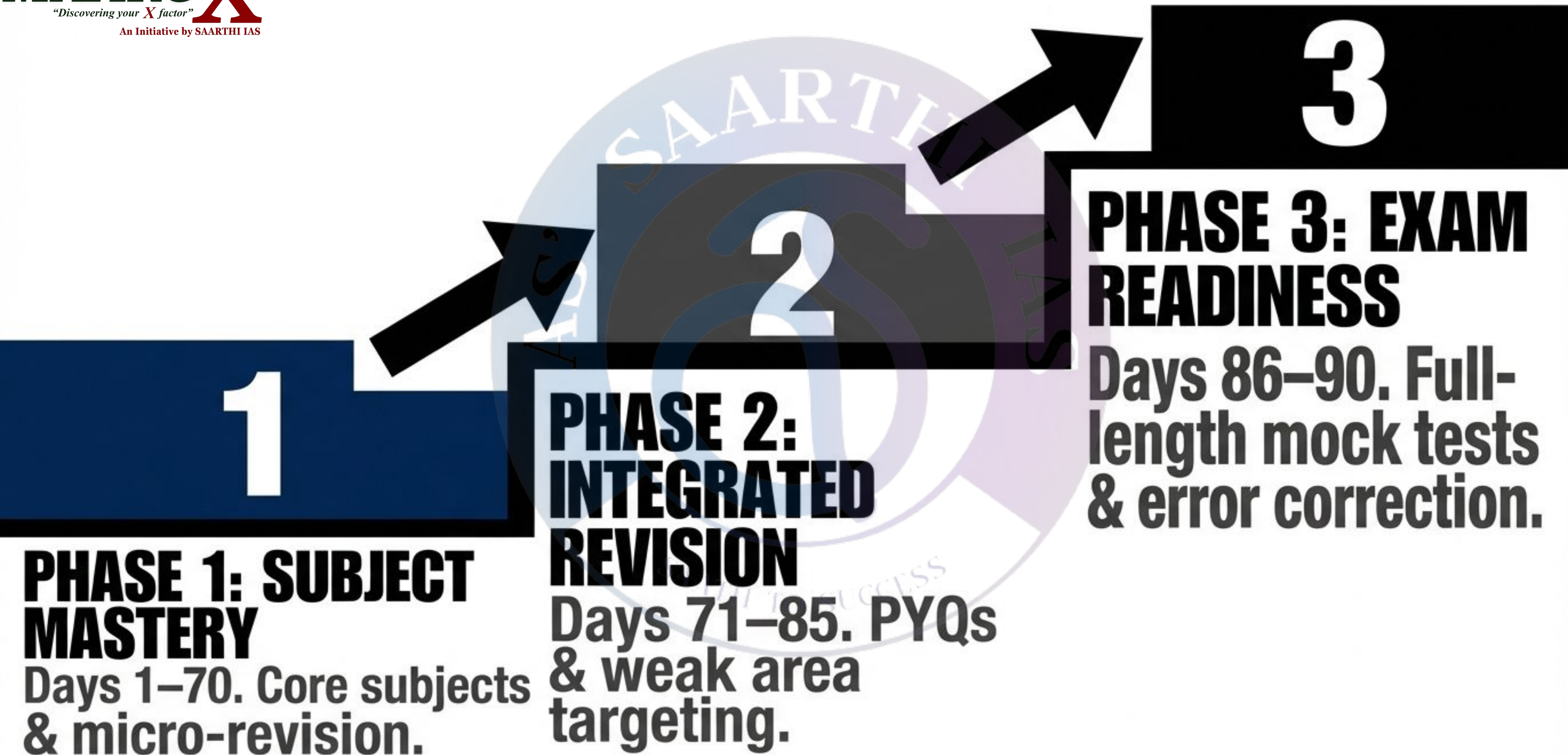

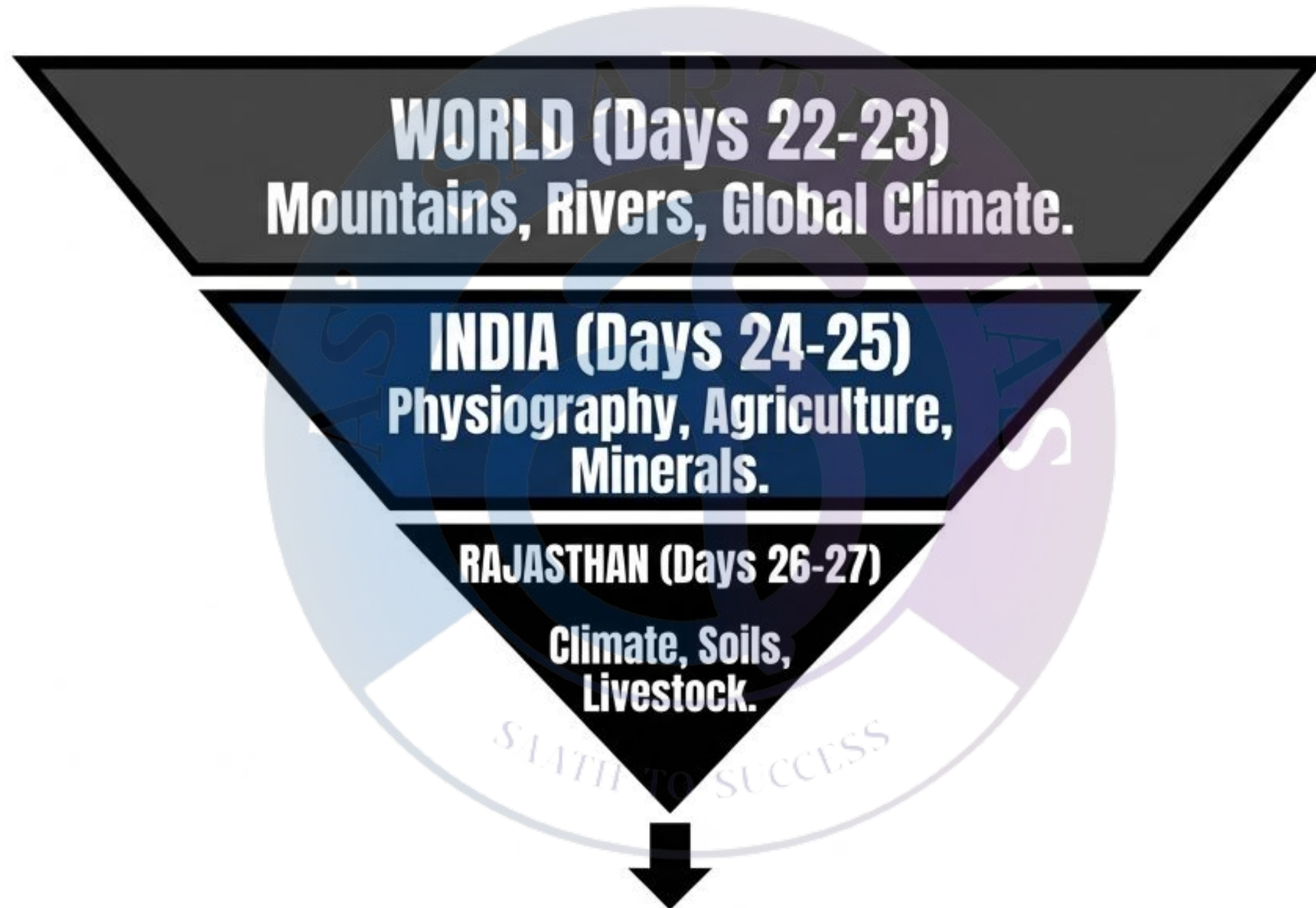

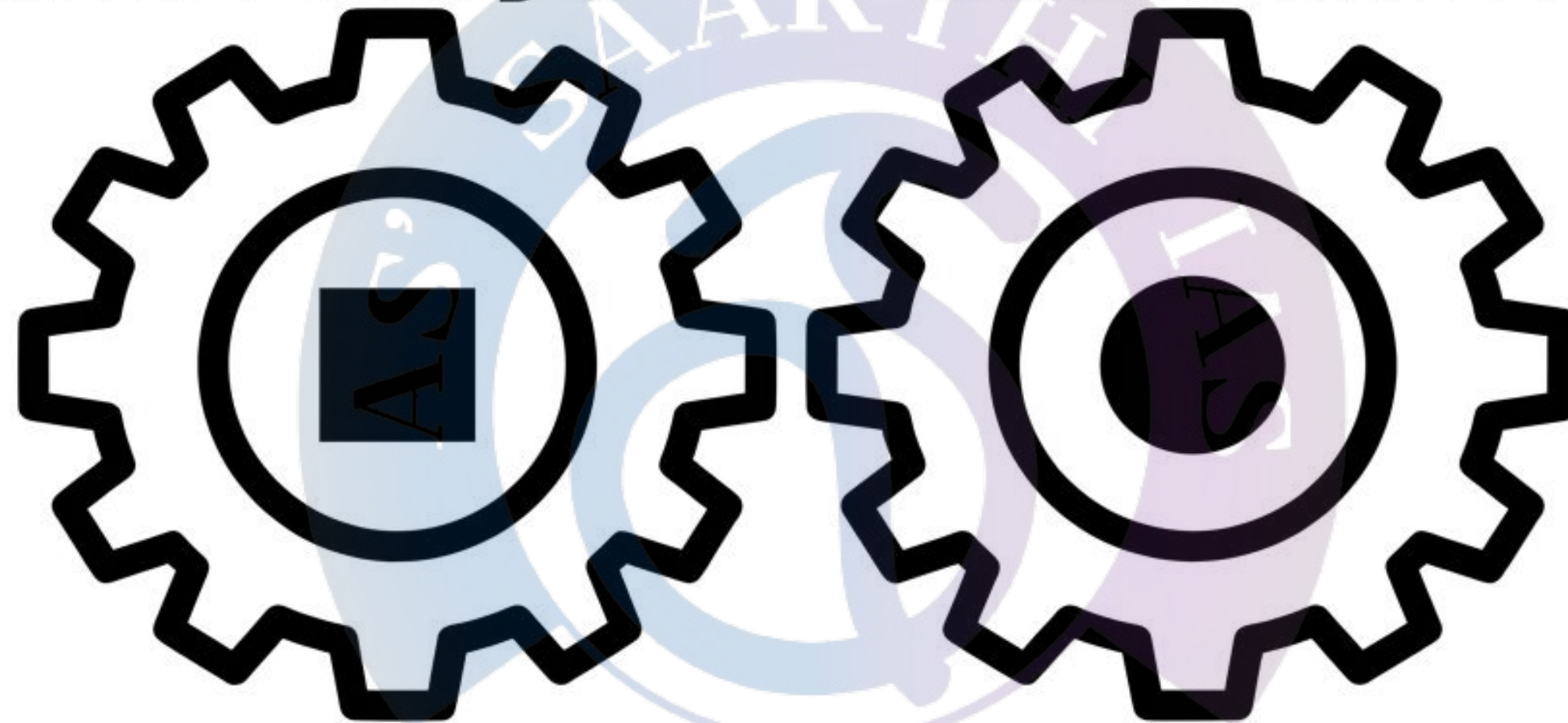

The Cumulative Revision Cascade



The Problem:
Traditional reading leaves earlier topics **forgotten by Day 180.**

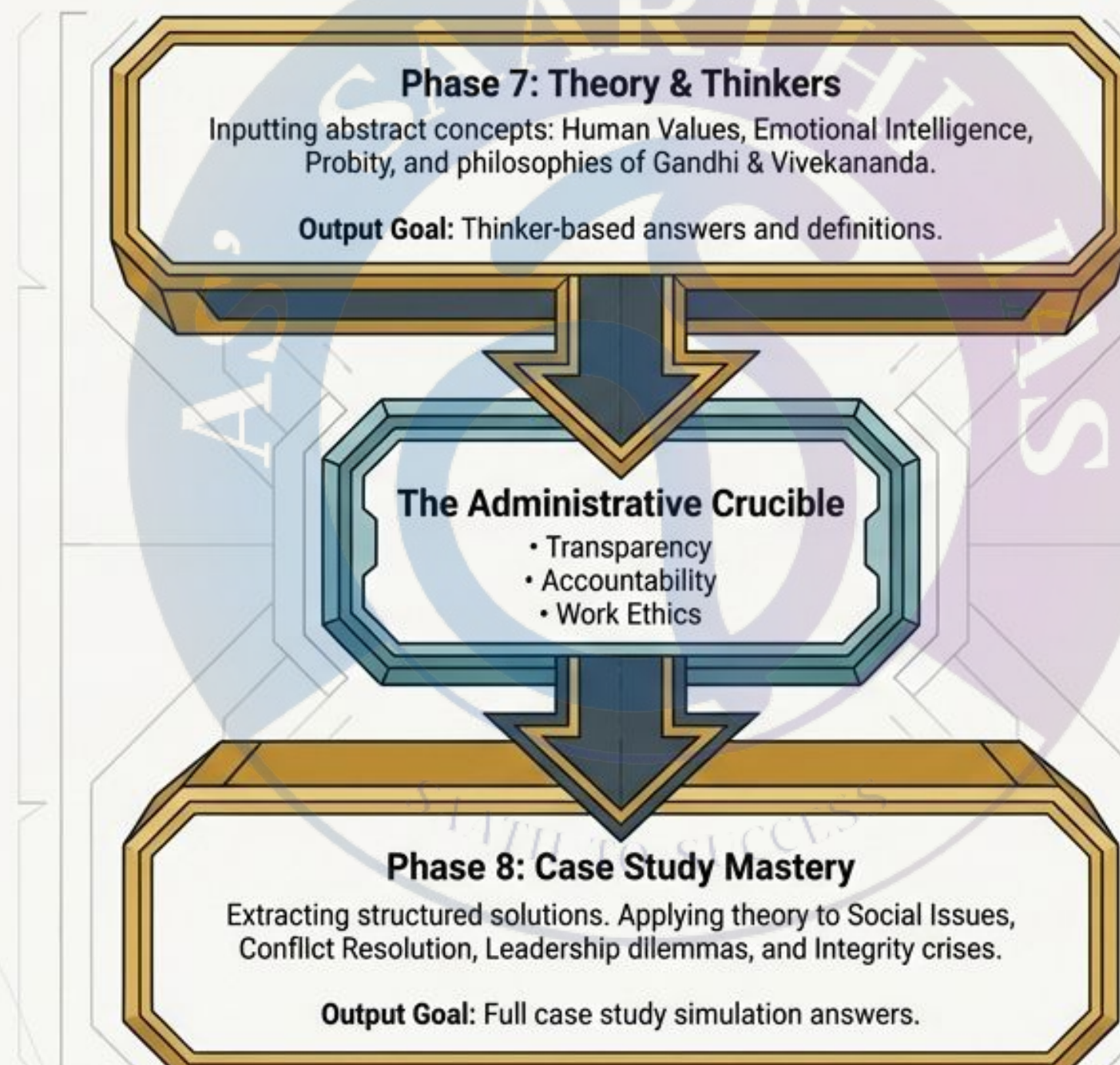

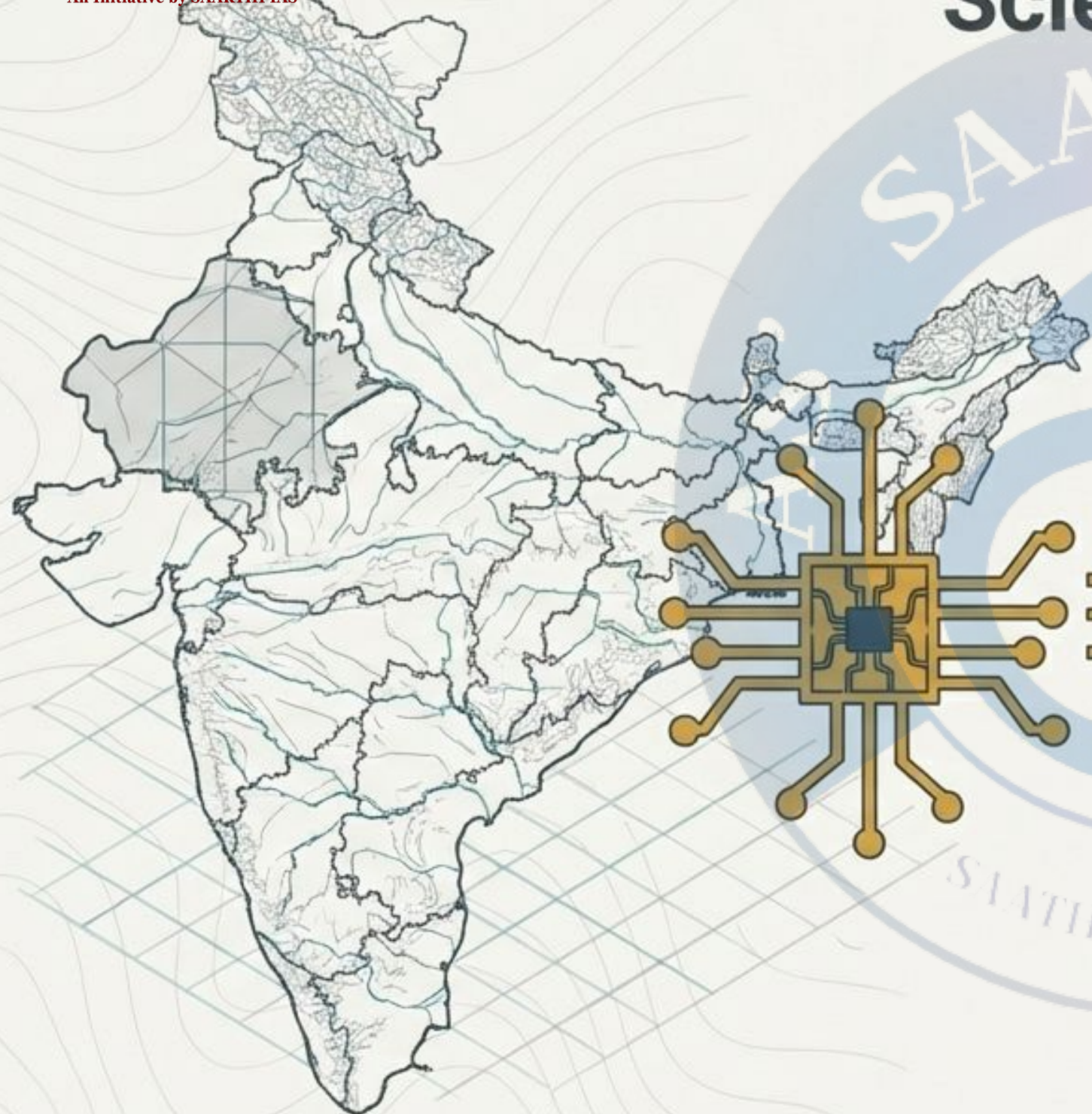

State resource management. Deep focus on the Aravalli, desert ecology, water irrigation, soils, minerals, and industrial transport infrastructure.

Foundation and Analysis. The Constitution, Fundamental Rights, Judiciary (SC/HC review), Federalism, and Amendments.

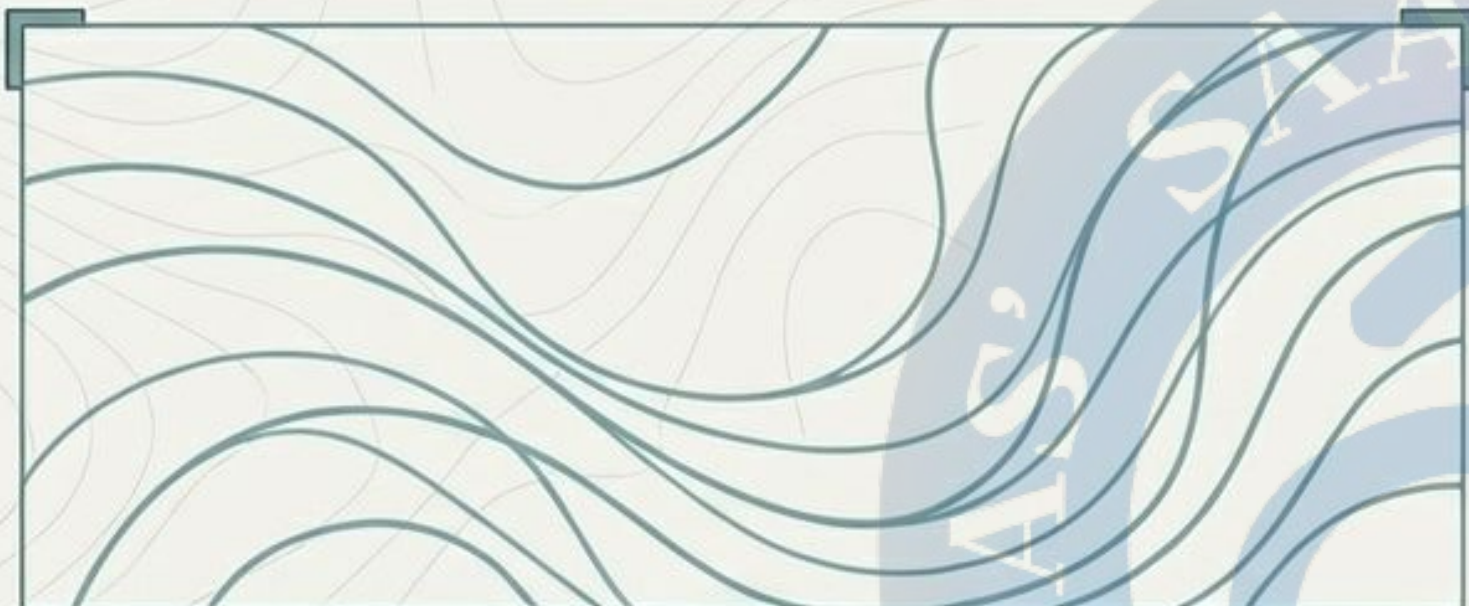
Phase 13: Governance (The Interface)

Legal Architecture

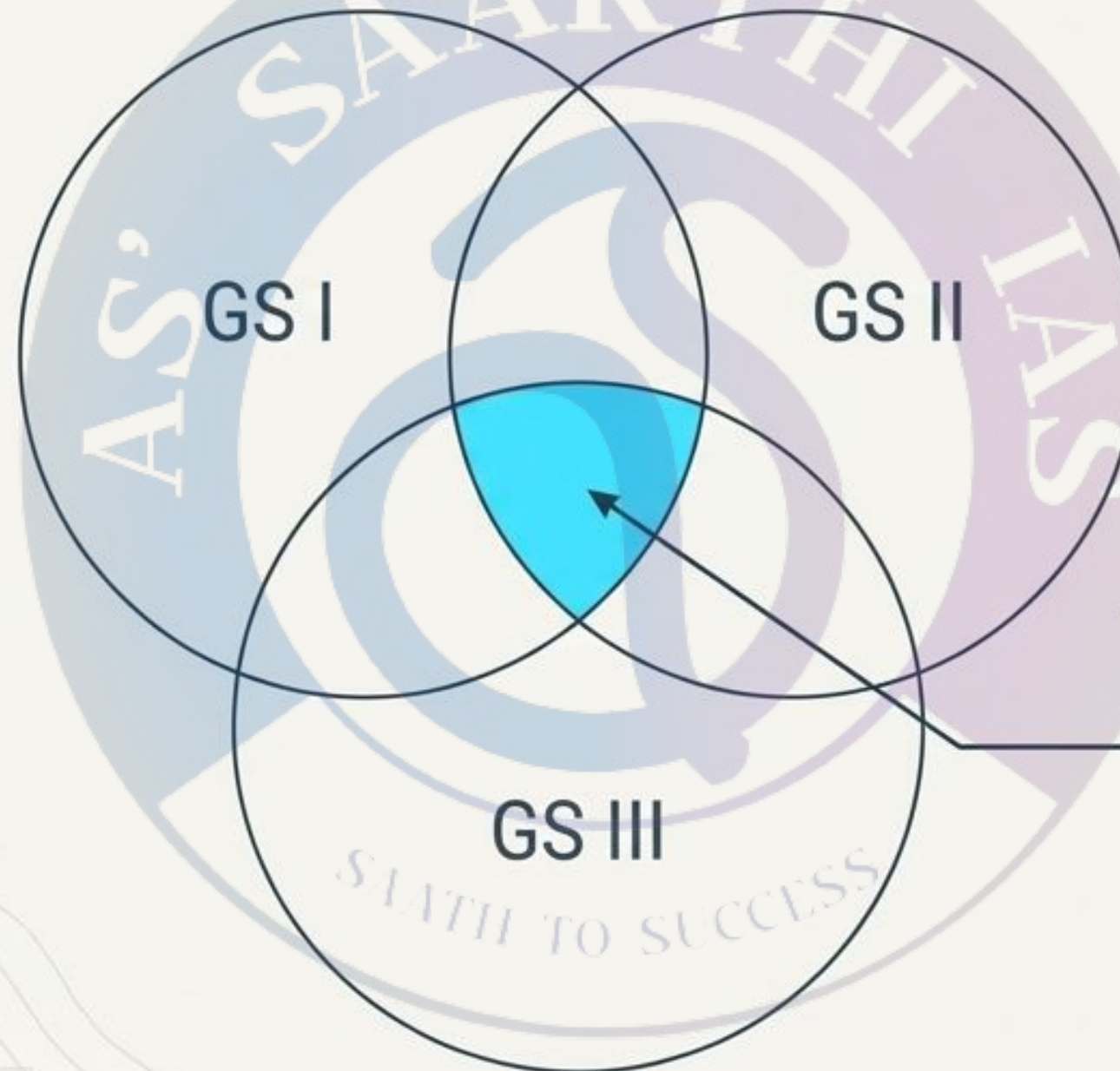
The legal boundaries of administration. Core legal concepts, Human Rights frameworks, crucial Acts, and analysis of current legal issues.

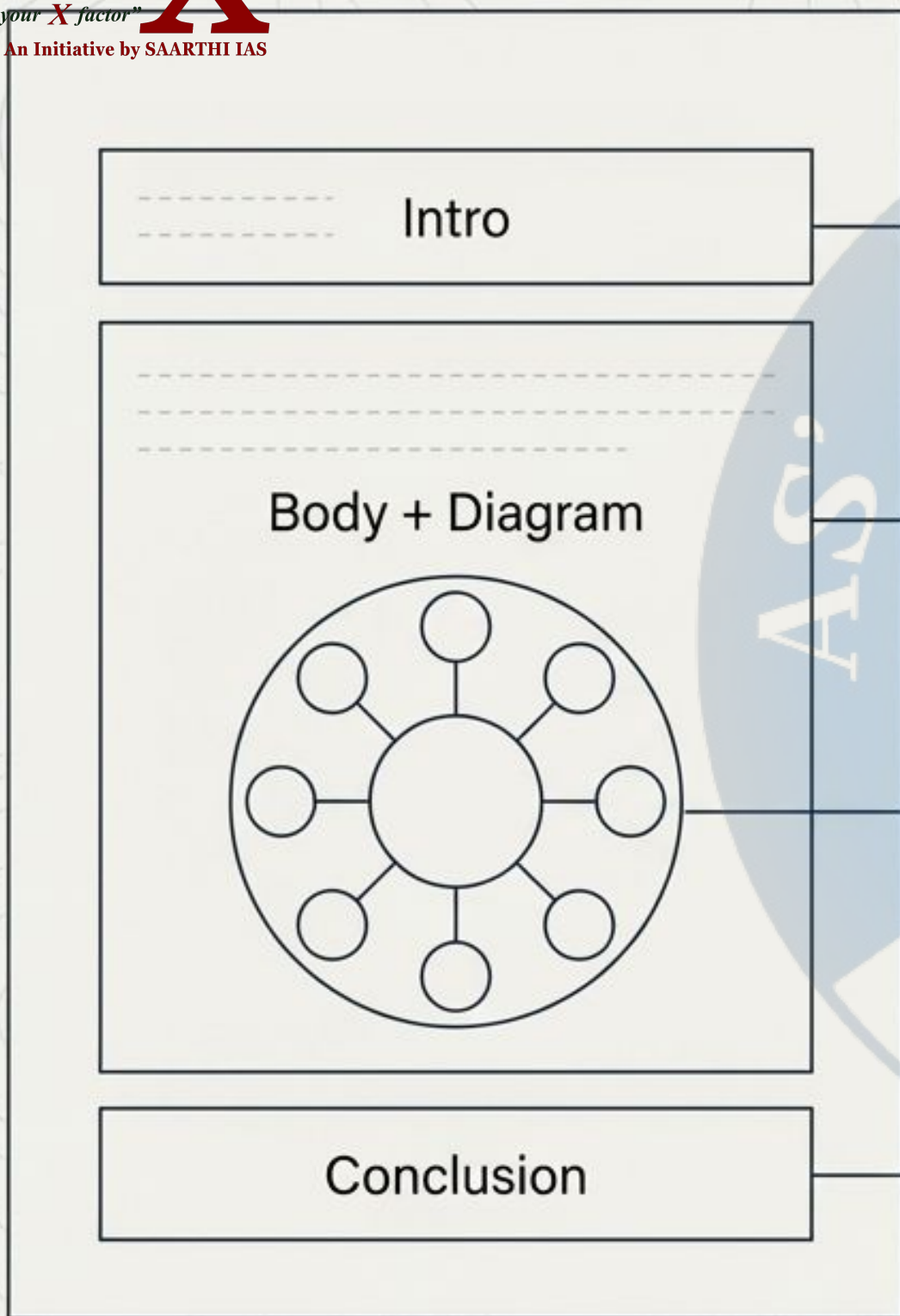
